Subject Area: World Languages

Course Name: AP (Advanced Placement) Latin—Vergil (G&T)

Summary: The AP program is intended for students who have a strong proficiency in the Latin language at the advanced level. The basic objective of this course is to progress in reading, translating, understanding, analyzing, and interpreting Latin from the original classical texts. Students are expected to be able to translate accurately from Latin into English the poetry they are reading, and to demonstrate a grasp of grammatical structures and vocabulary. This course requires an understanding of literary techniques of Latin writers and of poetic meters and when appropriate stylistic analysis is an integral part of the advanced work. The course also includes the study of the cultural, social, and political context of the literature. Students may take the AP Latin Language Examination.
